School Self Evaluation (SSE) is a process that schools all over the country are currently engaged in. It is a "collaborative, inclusive, and reflective process of internal school review".

The process of School Self Evaluation involves gathering information from a range of sources about the quality of teaching and learning in our school, and then making judgements. It culminates in the development of a School Improvement Plan which sets targets for improvement in certain areas.

In short, SSE allows us to look at what we, as a school are **doing well**, identify **areas for improvement**, set **targets** for improvement and **monitor and evaluate** how successfully we achieve our targets.



The guiding framework for the SSE process is Looking at Our School 2016, A Quality Framework for Post-Primary Schools. This document guides schools in the SSE process.

The ultimate purpose of SSE is to improve the quality of teaching and learning in our schools.
