Academics in TY

- We provide a strong academic programme in TY as we ensure that our students are prepared for the jump to Senior Cycle.
- Students will have 4 classes a week in the core subjects and will also study Leaving Cert Sciences, Businesses and Modern Foreign Languages.
- Assessment will be ongoing in all subjects throughout the year through the production of portfolios, projects and presentations. Cores will be examined twice a year by examinations. A stronger emphasis is placed on the May end of year exam as we prepare the girls for the oncoming academic emphasis in 5th year.
- Students also get to pick from a selection of other TY specific subjects.
