



Senior Cycle Planning

Work Experience

- Have paperwork submitted on time (Google Forms 2 weeks in advance).
- 2. Have at least 1st work placement sorted by now.
- Make sure Garda Vetting paperwork is returned and correctly filled out.
- 4. Make sure extra work placements are <u>approved</u>.
- 5. Get engaged and get the most out of the experience.

Garda Vetting

- Vetting is required for any work experience placements involving work with children or vulnerable adults.
- A student must be 16 to be vetted so the paperwork can only be submitted when your daughter's 16th birthday has passed.
- 3. The forms will be stored by the TY coordinator until then.

Additional work experiences

- Students can apply for one additional placement throughout the year. This placement should not be during Carlingford, musical or exams.
- There are some TY programmes in various companies which have been applied for during the summer. If OLS is successful in getting a place, it will be raffled off among interested students. Notification to express interest will be via Google Classroom.
- If students have an additional placement, they must first check the date with the TY Coordinator. When the date is agreed then the student submits an application online for an additional placement.








