PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Dear Parents & Guardians,

18th February, 2022

We approach the mid term break with a renewed energy and a greater sense of hope as we see changes that are gradually occurring as covid restrictions are lifted in wider society. We all look forward to hearing from the government about their plans for the lifting of restrictions in schools. The administrative team has contingency plans in place to alter the school building in line with any government guidelines. Despite the mammoth task ahead we are all energised by the prospect of returning our schools to a world where students can work together in groups, be involved in active learning and engage with each other without the restrictions of social distancing and masks.

We are delighted that we have been awarded government grants which will really enhance school facilities. The summer works grant will allow us to replace all the windows in the old building (built in 1953) and should assist decrease our rising energy costs.

An Bord Pleanala awarded planning permission to the school in 2018 for a state of the art sports dome. The school has been working behind the scenes to put in place a financial package to build the dome and we are heartened with the award of a \in 150,000 Sports Capital grant This will contribute in part, towards the construction of our eagerly anticipated sports dome providing world class facilities including three full size basketball courts, 2 futsal pitches and an all purpose sports pitch.

We would like to thank the Religious of Christian Education who are a constant support to the school and have also assisted us with this project. At a cost of over €1.5 million the sports dome represents a large financial commitment on behalf of the school. We look forward to the support of the parent body as we endeavour to offer our students the very best facilities to aid their holistic development.

We are hopeful that we can begin construction in the coming year and will update you further nearer the time.

3rd and 6th year students have applied themselves exceptionally well during their mock exams over the past 2 weeks. Following the government announcement about changes to LC 2022 we altered the 6th year mock papers to reflect the changes allowing our students the best opportunities to prepare for their June exams. TY students are currently engaging in a variety of work experience and community care placements and we eagerly await to hear how they got on.

4th year students continue to prepare their musical Matilda whilst both 4th and 5th years are collaborating with Terenure College in a production of High School Musical. We look forward to seeing these productions in the last term.

We wish our Minor A, Junior A and Senior A hockey teams the very best of luck in their respective semifinal matches after the midterm break.

A reminder to ensure that you are aware of the CLASS programme that runs at lunchtime and after school and to ensure that your daughter is availing of all the necessary additional supports where she needs them. The programme is constantly changing as we access different services that we can avail of.

We are delighted to announce that Our Lady's School has been awarded a €150,000 Sports Capital Grant by the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Sport and the Media. This will contribute, in part, towards the construction of our eagerly anticipated state of the art sports dome providing world class facilities including three full size basketball courts, two futsal pitches and an all purpose sports pitch. There will also be changing rooms, a sports office and a dedicated PE seminar room. These additional facilities will also enhance mental and physical wellbeing for the community.

We would like to thank our Board of Management and the Religious of Christian Education congregation for their commitment and dedication to this innovative project which will offer our students access to a top of the range sports facility.



Swimming Success at the Leinster Schools Competition


Toastmasters



Student Council


